"Who are Team XXX Million? You might well find that you are a member of the team. Thank you: Team XXX Million — Open Ears Many of us, are all too aware of hearing loss.

We live with it, every day. We've had no choice but to become aware of it. The charity, Royal National Institute for the Deaf (RNID), say that there are over 18 million adults in the UK who are deaf. **The theme for Deaf Awareness Week 2025 is, 'Beyond Silence'**. As well as celebrating the 18 million, let's also celebrate the XXX million represented by my niece. Those who have chosen to walk alongside people with hearing loss, allowing silence to become their world too, and, in doing so, showing that 'Beyond Silence' is possible.

When I lost my hearing, I was terrified. I was stuck in silence, and there was no beyond. Then cracks began to appear in the soundless wall surrounding me. My mum fingerspelling words to me. An audiologist I could understand. My dad speaking clearly for me to lipread. My sisters teasing me (our love language). All these, and many more, helped – and help - me find life beyond silence.

It isn't much fun for one, but two can stick together.
