PARISH NURSING NEWS

REFRESH is on Tuesday at 1.30: Please do pop in for a cuppa and bring a neighbour or friend or offer a lift to someone less able. The quiet reflective space will not be in action this week due to the chaos of the number one vestry as Judy, Lorraine and I will be trying to organise the lovely new cupboards between Refresh and meetings.

Wednesday is an all-day Parish Nursing Study day, right through to the evening. I may have to dip in and out of it – we will see.

Some of you may be concerned about the recent hospital league tables. Please remember they include such things as finances. Here is an excerpt of a CQC inspection at Coventry in March this year for the surgical dept.

We foundA strong safety culture was evident, where events were investigated, and learning was embedded to promote good practice. Good care and treatment was delivered in accordance with evidence-based practice, resulting in positive outcomes for patients. Staff were recognised for their kindness, compassion, and caring approach. The service was inclusive, ensuring that patients' individual needs and preferences were considered. Effective governance processes were operated by leaders, who used systems to manage performance efficiently.

The service did not meet NHS treatment standards due to the backlog caused by the COVID-19 pandemic across England. However, managers worked continuously to reduce waiting times and address the backlog, showing steady progress. The service collaborated with other healthcare professionals to ensure timely care, particularly for serious conditions requiring specialist input.

Most areas were graded good, and you can look at all areas on the CQC website

Saturday is **World Sepsis Day**. The importance of early diagnosis was really brought home to us by one of the mums at baby massage. She was unwell and pregnant and resisting family intervention to get her help. By the time she got to hospital she was rushed through and told if she had left it much longer, neither of them would have survived.

Guidance from the NHS websiteSymptoms of sepsis

Sepsis is life threatening. It can be hard to spotThere are lots of possible symptoms. They can be like symptoms of other conditions, including flu or a chest infection. If you think you or someone you look after has symptoms of sepsis, call 999 or go to A&E. Trust your instincts.

Immediate action required: Call 999 or go to A&E if:

A baby or young child has any of these symptoms of sepsis:

- blue, grey, pale or blotchy skin, lips or tongue on brown or black skin, this may be easier to see on the palms of the hands or soles of the feet
- a rash that does not fade when you roll a glass over it, the same as meningitis
- difficulty breathing (you may notice grunting noises or their stomach sucking under their ribcage), breathlessness or breathing very fast
- a weak, high-pitched cry that's not like their normal cry
- not responding like they normally do, or not interested in feeding or normal activities
- being sleepier than normal or difficult to wake

They may not have all these symptoms.

Immediate action required: Call 999 or go to A&E if:

An adult or older child has any of these symptoms of sepsis:

- acting confused, slurred speech or not making sense
- blue, grey, pale or blotchy skin, lips or tongue on brown or black skin, this may be easier to see on the palms of the hands or soles of the feet
- a rash that does not fade when you roll a glass over it, the same as meningitis
- difficulty breathing, breathlessness or breathing very fast

They may not have all these symptoms.

Find your nearest A&E

Do not drive to A&E. Ask someone to drive you or call 999 and ask for an ambulance. Bring any medicines you take with you.

Urgent advice: Call 111 now if:

You, your child or someone you look after:

- feels very unwell or like there's something seriously wrong
- has not had a pee all day (for adults and older children) or in the last 12 hours (for babies and young children)
- keeps vomiting and cannot keep any food or milk down (for babies and young children)
- has swelling or pain around a cut or wound
- has a very high or low temperature, feels hot or cold to the touch, or is shivering

Do not worry if you're not sure if it's sepsis – it's still best to call 111. They can tell you what to do, arrange a phone call from a nurse or doctor, or call you an ambulance.
